

Dear Family, in class today I learned about liquids and solids and made butter.

Did you know?

- Liquids can pour. Milk is a liquid.
- Solids cannot pour. Butter is a solid.
- Melted butter is a liquid.
- Butter is made from milk.

Ask your child:

- Tell me what makes a liquid different from a solid.
- Describe what you used to make butter.
- Explain how you made butter.

Vocabulary:

- characteristic – something that makes one thing different from another.
- liquid – something that can flow. It is not solid or a gas.
- solid – having a firm shape or form.
- butter – a solid yellow fat. Butter is made from milk.
- cream – the thick part of whole milk that contains fat.
- shake – to move something side to side or up and down. Shaking uses quick, short movements.

Activity:

Talk with your child about all the foods they eat that are liquids. Talk about all the foods they eat that are solids. On a piece of paper, help your child to write down their favorite liquid food. Have them write down their favorite solid food. Send the paper to school to share with us.
